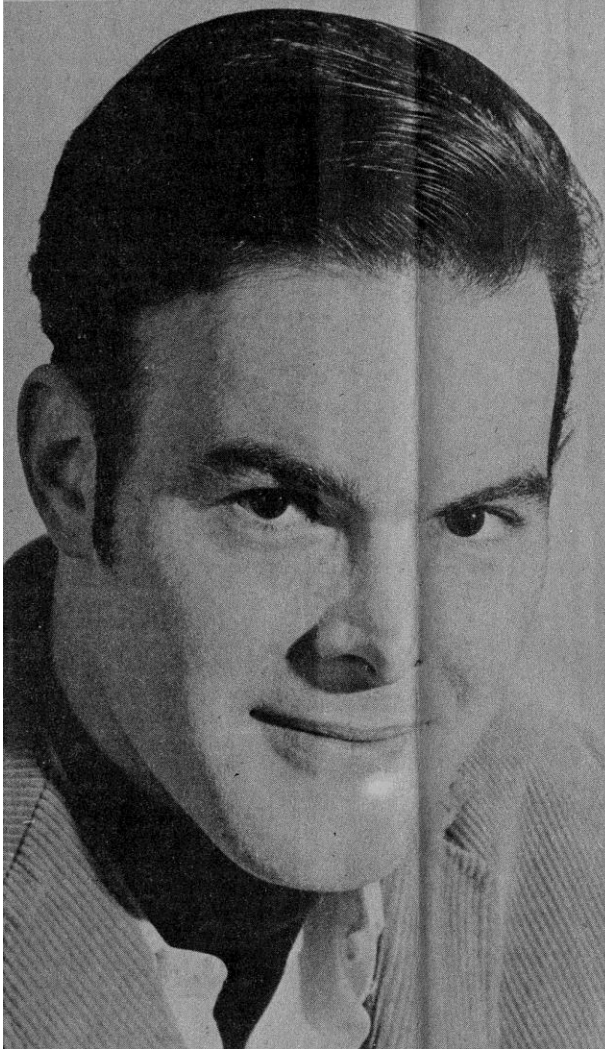


Painting Exhibition at Cultural Centre



A Spring Exhibition of forty-five paintings by Ronald Simpkins opens today at the Cultural Centre, 5955 Bannantyne Ave., and continues until the end of March.

The young artist is presenting paintings of many beautiful scenes that will be recognized by visitors to the Centre.

Winter scenes include "Late Afternoon December", "January Sunlight and Shadows", "Ice on the Rouge River", "Winter", "Ice on the St. Lawrence River", "Feeling of

Ice - Ile Perrot", "First Snow", "Waves of Snow, Shawbridge", "Shoreline Ice", "Winter Moods", "Winter in the Woods", "Winter Panorama", "Feeling of Winter", "Winter Stream", and "Shoreline Ice."

Among the Spring scenes are "Calumet Stream in Spring", "Shoreline of the St. Lawrence", "Colour of Spring", and "Pool of Water."

Autumn scenes such as "Fall Landscape", "Autumn in the Woods", "Gold in the Woods", "Autumn Colours", "Afternoon Shadows", "Autumn Brilliance", "Lawrence Mood", and "Fall Mood."

Summer scenes include "Pierce Street", "Approaching Storm on the River", "Thundering Surf", and "Street Scene."
